## Mobile Outreach

- Syringe Access Exchange Program (SAEP)
  - 3 SAEP sites (2 mobile, 1 fixed site)
  - HCV/HIV testing & linkage
  - Peer Support Specialist
- Mailed Naloxone Program
  - As of May 31, 2023 - 635 kits mailed in KY (57 counties)
  - Kit includes: naloxone, SAEP referral card, FindHelpNowKY.org, local NKY resource list, QR code for more kits. (Optional items: safer sex kits, sharps container, wound care kit)





# MORE Program

Since 2021, this program has:

- Had more than 22,500 interactions with participants
- Distributed more than 4,000 Narcan kits with overdose response education
- More than 700 participants reported they used VOH-supplied Narcan to save a life
- Distributed more than 1,500 fentanyl test strip kits
- Established more than 30 regular outreach sites in Lexington & Louisville
