

Firearm Injuries in Kentucky, 2017–2023

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Introduction

This report presents the burden of emergency department (ED) visits and inpatient hospitalizations due to firearm injuries among Kentucky residents. This report is supported by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) as part of Cooperative Agreement Number NU17CE010182 totaling \$250,000 with 0% financed with nongovernmental sources. Events represent encounters of care and may be greater than the total number of Kentucky residents who visited an ED or inpatient hospital. Non-Kentucky residents visiting a Kentucky ED or inpatient hospital are not included in the counts of events. This report also does not include events for Kentucky residents who visited an ED or inpatient hospital located outside of the Commonwealth. These limitations result in a likely undercount of all firearm ED or inpatient hospital visits that occurred in Kentucky or among Kentucky residents.

Numbers less than five and rates based on numbers less than 10 were suppressed in accordance with state data management policy. Rates based on numbers less than 20 are unstable and should be interpreted with caution. Population estimates are based on the U.S. Census Bureau's Annual County Resident Population Estimates by Age, Sex, Race, and Hispanic Origin.

Definitions

The data source for the Kentucky resident data in this report is the Kentucky Outpatient Services Database Files and Inpatient Hospitalization Claims Files, Office of Data and Analytics, Cabinet for Health and Family Services. Data are provisional and subject to change. The definitions used in this report conform to the standards set by the Council of State and Territorial Epidemiologists for identifying injury events using hospital records. The identification of a firearm-related ED or inpatient hospital visit was based on ICD-10-CM codes listed under any diagnosis category, not solely on the primary diagnosis. Firearm-related injuries of all intents (i.e., unintentional, suicide, homicide, and undetermined) were included in this report, unless otherwise stated. Only events representing initial encounters were included in this report, as determined by a seventh character in the ICD-10-CM code of "A" or missing. The following ICD-10 codes were used to identify firearm-related injuries:

Executive Summary

- A total of **1,420** firearm-related ED visits and inpatient hospitalizations occurred in 2023.
- Since 2021 the numbers of firearm-related ED visits and inpatient hospitalizations have been decreasing.
- There was a total of **763** visits among non-Hispanic white residents in 2023.
- There was a total of **595** visits among non-Hispanic Black residents in 2023.
- The age group with the most firearm-related injury visits in 2023 were **15–24**-**year-olds**.
 - Numbers of visits among those aged 15-24: 470
- The majority of firearm-related injuries (**1,004** ED visits and inpatient hospitalizations in 2023) were **unintentional**.
- The Kentuckiana Regional Planning and Development Agency (KIPDA) Area Development District (ADD) had the highest number and rate of firearm-related injury visits at 805 visits and a rate of 78.9 per 100,000 population. It is important to acknowledge that this observation in the KIPDA ADD is influenced by the high count and rate of firearm-related injuries in Jefferson County.




Figure 2: Rate of unintentional firearm injuries among Kentucky residents treated in Kentucky ED visits and inpatient facilities by Area Development Districts, 2019-2023






Figure 3: Rate of assault and legal intervention firearm injuries among Kentucky residents seen during ED visits and inpatient hospitalizations by Area Development Districts, 2019-2023
