
2024 Angel Initiative Program Acceptance Statistics¹

The Angel Initiative proactively helps individuals battling substance use disorder find treatment options that best fit their needs. Individuals seeking help can visit any Kentucky State Police (KSP) post and an angel coordinator will work with them to quickly locate a treatment facility within the state with availability. Per executive order, the Angel Initiative was suspended from April 2020 through February 2021. From December 2019 through December 2024, 174 candidates were served through the Angel Initiative.

In 2024, 19 persons sought assistance at KSP posts. 84% of Angel Initiative candidates were accepted and placed in treatment, 5% were accepted and not placed in treatment, and 11% were not accepted in accordance with KSP General Order OM-B-23.



5% of Angel Initiative candidates had a middle school education, 21% had some high school education, 26% had completed high school/GED, 11% had some college, and 37% did not disclose their education.



42% had health insurance, while 21% did not; 37% failed to disclose whether they had health insurance.



26% were homeless; 32% did not disclose information regarding their housing.



32% had dependents, 42% did not, and 26% did not disclose whether they had dependents.



63% did not have U.S. military history and 37% did not disclose military history.







2024 Angel Initiative Candidate Drug-Related Characteristics

- > 47% did not disclose




Main Drug* for Seeking Angel Initiative Help

*Multiple drugs may have been reported as impetus for seeking help.



Of the 19 total Angel Initiative candidates in 2024, 79% (15) were transported to facilities by troopers, 5% (1) were transported to facilities by a family/friend, 11% (2) did not require transport to any facility, and 5% (1) of candidates' transport was undisclosed.




*Of the 15 Angel Initiative candidates who were transported to a treatment facility in 2024, 60% (9) were transported in one trooper relay to facilities, 27% (4) were transported in two trooper relays to facilities, and 13% (2) were transported in three trooper relays to facilities.
